What Matters to You – You Said

It's time to update our priorities. Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

Priority 1) THEFT OF TOOLS FROM WORKS VEHICLES

You said there has been an increase in the theft of tools from vans on the Bardon Beat including in Greenhill, Hugglescote and Whitwick. In response this will be one of our priorities. Take the opportunity now to review where your van is parked, where your tools are stored and the security measures you have to protect these. Please follow Neighbourhood Link (NHL) and Facebook for up-to-date news and crime prevention advice.

Priority 2) SPEEDING VEHICLES

Speeding on the Beat has been reported to us through NHL and face to face. Concerns have been raised on Grange Road, Hugglescote, Main Street, Heather and Cropston Drive, Greenhill. This will now be one of our priorities. Speed is one of the FATAL 4 offences and is the biggest cause of casualties. We will focus on tackling this across the Bardon Beat.

Priority 3) PARKING ISSUES

Parking has been reported as a problem on key roads in Ibstock and outside schools at drop off and pick up times especially in Ellistown, Hugglescote and Whitwick. The pavement and roads should be safe for all to use particularly the most vulnerable in our community. We will prioritise these areas and dealing with those parking dangerously or inconsiderately.


