

D-day was the day on which the Allied landings took place in Normandy.



Whitwick Scout Group have been looking at ways to directly involve older Scout and Explorer Sections whilst creating a fitting community event to commemorate this important occasion.

Whilst making it simple to manage, we came across this image of a parade at the Kandersteg Scout centre in Switzerland which seemed a positive way to involve many Scouts.



Certainly, with 13x Big (8ft x 5ft) Flags and flaming torch bearers, to represent the countries directly involved, with 6x Scouts per flag to carry, that's direct involvement for 118 Scouts and Explorers, watched by family, members and residents of the village, along with the Royal British Legion who have also invited Scouts to attend their event on the Sunday 9th June at the Clock tower in Coalville..

With funding, sponsorship and donations, we hope to zero any cost to the group and raise some funds for the Royal British Legion in the process.

The event will all be within a 2.5hr window, on the night of the 6th June (7:30-10pm) 2024.

Following several months of planning and paperwork. We have submitted Road Closure information to the Leicestershire County Council Events Team and registered the Event with NWLDC. The Scouts are covered by Scout Association Public Liability Insurance provided by Unity.

The Route of the Parade was planned by the organising sub-committee, it was suggested that a route from the war memorial to the Beacon, following a short church service would be most fitting, and I'm pleased to advise Whitwick Parish Church are holding a commemorative Service prior to the parade.

Equally, it was decided that we should look to invite other Scout sections from across the district, this we have done and are expected to have over one hundred Scouts taking part in the parade, along with members of the Royal British Legion and invited guests.

Members of the public are encouraged to join and follow the parade to the Beacon Site in fact we are organising a raffle to help fund the event, with 25 flaming torches on offer enabling members of the public (over 18) to join with the parade, with proceeds beyond costs to the RBL.

Draft Plan and Timing of Events:

Route - War memorial to Scout Hut

19:30 Church Service Whitwick St. John the Baptist.

RBL, Seaforth Highlanders Band and Scouts sections from across the district invited.

20:15 Wreath laid at the war memorial.

Band Plays, Symbolic lantern and torch lit.

20:15 Road Closure Full Parade Route.

Following the confirmed Road Closure.

20:20 Parade assembles - North Street (outside church).

Parade assembly, Band, RBL, Guests and Scouts.

The 80x procession Torches will be distributed to over 18's or group members.

20:30 Parade departs.

Down North Street, through Marketplace, towards the City of Dan.

20:40 Pause of the Main Procession in the City of Dan.

The Parade will pause at the mining wheel in the City of Dan for up to 10mins, whilst the band plays, the less able musicians may then drop out prior to the walk-up Leicester Road.

Once the Parade is with the boundary of the City of Dan, North Street, Church Lane, Marketplace, silver street and Hall Lane, closures can be re-opened, allowing traffic flow.

20:50 Procession Departs the City of Dan

The procession will walk up Leicester Road from the City of Dan, turning left into the Scout field.

21:05 Parade Turns into Scout Field

21:15 The official Beacon lighting time, by this time our procession should be at the Scout hut field, with everyone in place around the Beacon.

On arrival at the Scout Field the Beacon lighting will begin, first the Ibstock Brick Brass band will play the National Anthem. As the Beacons and Lamps are lit, we ask all those taking part to stop what they are doing and undertake The International Tribute.

The Brass Band will entertain the crowd during the Beacon lighting.

The lighting of the Beacon may be followed by a short firework display, should funds allow.


21:45 Crowd starts to disperse. People will start to depart from the Scout Field, leaving via footpaths.

22:30 All Road Closures end.

Note: Events and timings are as known 27th March 2024 and may be subject to adjustment.

Note:

- 1. Flaming Torches should only be ignited within 15 minutes of the departure time.
- 2. Sunset is scheduled for 21:12pm.
- 3. Water filled 'fire buckets' will be available at marshalling posts and placed on doorsteps throughout the parade route. Pubs on route also asked to make a hose pipe available.
- 4. Traffic Marshals, the Scouts shall be supported by the Loughborough Land Rover Club
